



The Bring Jobs Home Act: Examples of Businesses Bringing Jobs Back to America

Advanced Manufacturing

- [AmFor Electronics](#) insourced production of wire harnesses from China and Mexico to Portland Oregon. [[The Boston Consulting Group](#), 3/2012]
- [Caterpillar](#) has made major new domestic investments, insourcing jobs that traditionally have gone to Japan, Mexico and China. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]
- [DuPont](#) started a new \$500 million plant to produce Kevlar in Charleston, South Carolina. The company also invested \$150 million in expanding its photovoltaic film production facility in Circleville, Ohio; and \$150 million in agricultural research in Iowa, Pennsylvania, and Delaware. - [ET Water Systems](#) recently relocated its irrigation control manufacturing production and assembly from China to San Jose, California. [[The Boston Consulting Group](#), 3/2012]
- [Siemens](#) is spending over \$50 million per year training its American workers in order to take advantage of American productivity and innovation. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]

Automotive

- [AGS Automotive Systems](#) recently elected to make an investment in excess of \$20 million to add new manufacturing capabilities to permit it to manufacture a portion of the bumper impact assemblies in Michigan. The new business will likely represent in excess of \$100 million in annual sales over the next 5 years and will enable AGS to retain approximately 50 jobs and create over 100 new jobs in Michigan. - [Ford](#) has committed to bringing more elements of its supply chain in-house, insourcing nearly 2,000 jobs in 2012, while opening a new research facility in Silicon Valley. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]
- [Rolls-Royce](#) dedicated its Crosspointe, Virginia plant, the company's newest facility in the world and its first facility in the U.S. built from the ground up. The Crosspointe plant

produces aero engine discs for both Boeing and Airbus aircraft and will result in a \$500 million dollar investment and 500 jobs. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]

Traditional Manufacturing

- [All-Clad Metalcrafters](#) makes high end cookware. The company has insourced production of lids back from China to the United States. [[The Boston Consulting Group](#), 3/2012]
- [Chesapeake Bay Candle](#) is in the process of hiring 100 workers to staff its new 117,000 square foot plant in Maryland that will produce the company's signature candles. The plant represents the company's first expansion in the United States in 16 years and will supplement existing facilities in China and Vietnam. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]
- [Farouk Systems](#) insourced a portion of its assembly line for hair irons and dryers from China and Korea to Houston, Texas. [[The Boston Consulting Group](#), 3/2012]
- [Keen](#) a footwear designer opened a 15,000-square-foot facility to manufacture boots in Portland, Oregon – moving production from China to a location five miles from its corporate headquarters. [[The White House](#), 1/2012]
- [Lincolnton Furniture](#) is a specialty furniture maker in North Carolina. The company has [reopened a facility](#) on a site that was closed when new ownership moved the previous residents, a furniture company once owned by the family of Lincolnton's CEO, to China. - [Master Lock](#) is the world's largest manufacturer of padlocks and related security products. Over the last couple years Master Lock has started to insource jobs to its facility in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The company currently sells over 50 products manufactured exclusively with US component parts. [[The White House](#), 1/2012]
- [Otis](#) has invested in a major new plant in South Carolina that will produce energy-efficient elevators for US and Canadian customers. The facility will result in 360 new jobs in South Carolina. [[The White House](#), 1/2012]
- [ThyssenKrupp](#) spent nearly \$5 billion on a new steel manufacturing plant in Calvert, Alabama. 30,000 people worked on constructing the steel and stainless steel production facility. The finished plant will eventually employ 2,700 permanent employees. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012, [ThyssenKrupp](#), 12/16/2010]

Service

- [GalaxE Solutions](#) is the creator of the "Outsource to Detroit" program that led to the company insourcing hundreds of jobs to Detroit. GalaxE develops software solutions for large corporations with a focus on health care. The company has been able to realize cost efficiencies and deliver improved service by bringing hundreds of jobs back from overseas. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]

- [Novo 1](#) is a call center company that has brought jobs from centers all over the world back to the United States, opening facilities in Michigan and Texas. [[The White House](#), 1/11/2012]
- [US Airways](#) has insourced 400 jobs to call centers in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Phoenix and Reno, Nevada. [[Bloomberg Businessweek](#), 11/1/2011]
